






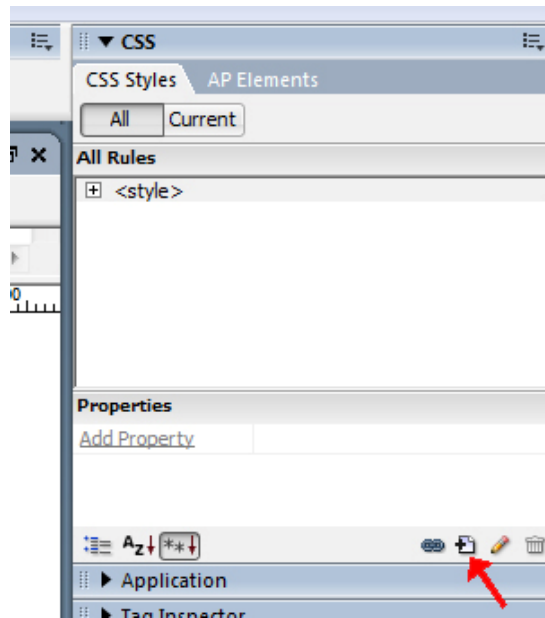
Creating a Navigation Menu in Dreamweaver



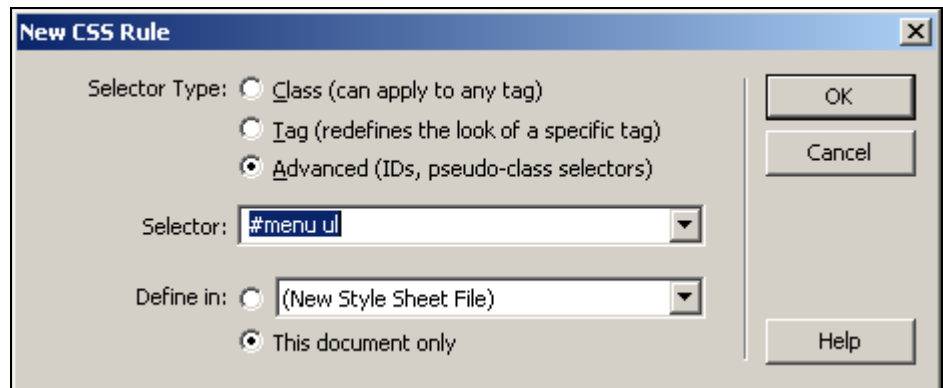
Step	Instructions
1. Create a layer for the menu	<p>a. Insert ► Layout Objects ► AP Div</p> <p>b. resize and position the new layer (you can resize/reposition anytime)</p> <p>c. rename the layer to menu in the CSS pane under the AP Elements tab</p> 
2. Add an unordered list	<p>➤ click Unordered List button  in Properties pane</p>
3. Type in menu items	<p>➤ type in the name for each item, typing Enter between each</p> 
4. Make menu items into links	<p>a. highlight first item (usually the current page)</p> <p>b. click Hyperlink button  on toolbar</p> <p>c. in Link field, type in address for the item</p> <p>d. click OK</p> <p>e. repeat above with the remaining items</p> 

5. Get rid of bullets

a. on the **CSS Styles** tab, click **New CSS Rule** button

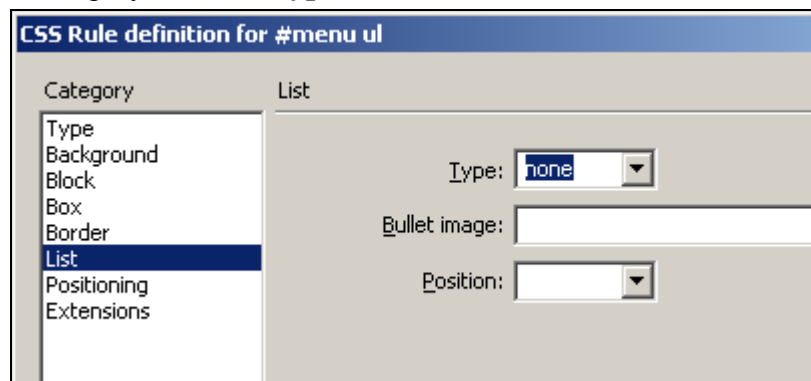


b. in **Selector** field, type in **#menu ul**






c. click **OK**

d. under Category **List**, for **Type** choose **none**



e. click **OK**

	
6. Set menu background color	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu under Category Background, for Background color choose the color you want click OK
7. Set menu items color	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, click New CSS Rule button in Selector field, type in #menu a click OK under Category Type, for Color choose the color for the items click OK
8. Set menu items font	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu a under Category Type, for Decoration choose none for Font, Size, Style, and Weight choose what you want (press Apply to see what the changes would look like) click OK
9. Set mouse-over color	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, click New CSS Rule button in Selector field, type in #menu a: hover click OK under Category Type, for Color choose the color for the items when the user moves the mouse over the menu item (you won't see this color until you test the page in a browser) click OK
10. Set menu orientation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, click New CSS Rule button in Selector field, type in #menu li decide which menu orientation you want: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Horizontal menu: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ under Category Block, for Display choose inline ➤ Vertical menu: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ under Category Block, for Display choose list-item click OK 
11. Set horizontal spacing between items (for horizontal menus)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu li under Category Box, for Margin uncheck Same for all for Margin Right enter how many pixels you want between menu items

	<p>d. click OK</p> 
<p>12. Set vertical spacing between items (for vertical menus)</p>	<p>a. on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu li b. under Category Box, for Margin uncheck Same for all c. for Margin Bottom enter how many pixels you want between menu items d. click OK</p>
<p>13. Set menu left margin</p>	<p>a. on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu ul b. under Category Box, for Margin uncheck Same for all c. under Category Box, for Margin: Left choose how many pixels over you want the first menu item to appear d. click OK</p>
<p>14. Set menu top margin</p>	<p>a. on the CSS Styles tab, double click on the style #menu ul b. under Category Box, for Margin uncheck Same for all c. under Category Box, for Margin: Top choose how many pixels down you want the first menu item to appear d. click OK</p>
